For hygiene reasons, we are purchasing individual communion glasses (and the associated trays) to replace the shared glasses that we currently use. At the same time, we are seeking to establish a more effective rota for serving and clearing away tea and coffee (Ruth Randall may already have tapped on your shoulder!). Obviously, the new communion glasses will also require washing up and so it makes sense for the good folk who "do" the tea and coffee to also clear away the communion glasses and plates. It will be great if as many people as possible will share in this act of worship in the kitchen (although not all at the same time!). Ruth will include some simple guidelines with the rota, so it will be easy to know exactly what needs to be done."
